About the Declared Disaster Recovery Fund

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has allocated \$3,240,899 to nonprofit developers in Davidson County through the Declared Disaster Recovery Fund (DDRF) to address emergency community development needs resulting from tornados, wind damage and the flooding that impacted multiple communities in Davidson County in March and May 2020.



Eligible Projects for Funding

The DDRF funds are being allocated to nonprofit developers for housing acquisition and rehabilitation to preserve affordable housing. All activities will benefit households at or below 80% of the area median income (AMI) and properties that were damaged from the storms in March and May 2020.



Application Process

Once the interview is complete and if it is determined your project is eligible, a formal application can be submitted via the Neighborly Software portal.
