Our Mission

The mission of the Metropolitan **Development and Housing** Agency (MDHA) is to create quality affordable housing opportunities, support neighborhoods, strengthen communities and help build a greater Nashville.





HOME-ARP Overview

Issued by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) as a part of the American Rescue Plan (ARP)

- Provides \$5 billion to serve Qualifying Populations (QP) who may be:
 - **1. Experiencing homelessness**
 - 2. At risk of experiencing homelessness
 - 3. Fleeing, or attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking or human trafficking
 - 4. Other qualifying factors



HOME-ARP Overview

ORIGINAL ALLOCATION PLAN

- Davidson County received \$9,315,028
- Community consultation process held
- Allocation Plan submitted by MDHA to HUD for approval in 2022

- MDHA's Allocation Plan approved by HUD in September 2022
- Plan proposed to use most of the funding to develop affordable rental housing
- In January 2023, HUD shared plans to send all plans back to communities
- An amendment to expand services to additional QPs was necessary
- MDHA requested technical assistance from HUD to amend the plan



HOME-ARP Overview

CHANGING NEEDS

- In 2021, Most pressing need was affordable supportive housing units, followed by funding for support services
- More than 400 additional units of permanent supportive housing will be available in the next few months
- Funding needed for customized services to ensure successful tenancies and reduce returns to homelessness


PROPOSED CHANGES

ORIGINAL PLAN

- 72% of allocation \$6.7 million for rental housing development
- Preference for Coordinated Entry system referrals

AMENDMENT 1

- 85% of allocation \$7,917,774 for supportive services
- Services accessible to all QPs with preference for individuals experiencing chronic homelessness within Coordinated Entry system referrals



Key Changes: Preferences and Priorities

Preferences: Homelessness with sub-population priority for chronic homelessness

Priorities: Supportive services Referrals: Coordinated entry and self reports



Timeline and Next Steps

- Planning and input phase now through June 5
- Draft HOME-ARP Allocation Plan Amendment 1 review and comment phase June 6 – July 8
 - Virtual public hearing June 13
 - Comments summarized and incorporated in the final draft
- Approval phase
 - MDHA Board of Commissioners on Oct. 8
 - Metro Council on Nov. 12
- Submit to HUD after Metro Council approval
- HUD approval 45 days after submission
