- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
- HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME)
- Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)
- Housing for Persons With AIDS (HOPWA)

Allocations and Program Descriptions

CDBG

\$5,074,394

- Benefit people who earn a low or moderate income through services and community improvements
- Aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight
- Meet a need having a particular urgency (urgent need)

HOME

\$2,295,090

- Provide decent affordable housing to households that earn a limited income
- Expand the capacity of non-profit housing providers
- Rental and homeownership development, homebuyer financing, tenantbased rental assistance (TBRA)
- Leverage private sector participation

ESG

\$432,661

 Provide essential services related to emergency shelter, rehabilitation and conversion of buildings to be used as emergency shelters, operation of emergency shelters and homelessness prevention services

HOPWA

\$2,422,025

- Provide housing assistance and related supportive services to meet the housing needs of people who earn a limited income and their families living with HIV/AIDS
- Help clients maintain housing stability, avoid homelessness and improve access to treatment and related care


2024 Goals

- Increase the number of decent, safe affordable housing units and help low-and moderate-income (LMI) households access affordable housing.
- Preserve existing affordable housing stock for LMI homeowners and tenants.
- Support facilities and services for those experiencing homelessness and people with HIV/AIDS.
- Provide essential services to LMI and vulnerable populations.
- Revitalize distressed neighborhoods and underserved areas through public facility and infrastructure improvements.
