


The 2025 LYDIA Society Assembly of Girls, most of whom are MDHA


New this year, MDHA's Resident Services Department also established **Abraham's Window**, a development program for pre-teen and teenage boys living in MDHA housing. The program taught the

The MDHA VOICE Center features several in-house partners who offer services to residents. This includes the **Oasis Center's micro drop-in space for youth ages 10-17**. It provides afterschool education assistance, school truancy prevention, arts and cultural enrichment activities, mentoring and additional wraparound support resource referrals for youth and their families. The drop-in center is open weekly from 10:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, and 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Fridays. It is closed on Tuesdays. The MDHA VOICE Center is located at 78 Lafayette St. in South Nashville.
